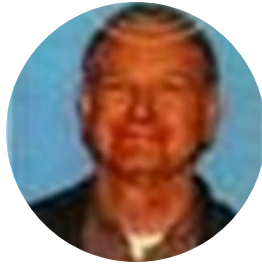

Marie Beck. Kerrol was a certified member of the American Society for Quality Control and worked as a quality control manager for several manufacturing companies in San Diego during his career.
