He was a graduate of Petoskey High School, San Diego State College, and held a General Teaching Credential. David enlisted in the United States Navy serving as a Corpsman specializing in dentistry. Upon his honorable discharge he worked for a time as an arborist and women's shoe salesman for Karl's Footwear to pay his way through college. After graduating he settled on a career with the San Diego County Probation Department (for Juveniles). He retired early and enjoyed many years of travel and adventure, and for a time he split his residency between Eugene, Oregon and San Diego. David passed from complications resulting from cancer. Per David's wishes, no services are planned.
